

## FROM THE FOUNDERS



#### How our Founders viewed a government's ability to collect revenue:

"The ability of a country to pay taxes must always be proportioned, in a great degree, to the quantity of money in circulation, and to the <u>celerity</u> with which it circulates." Federalist Paper #12

Our national debt has caused economic chaos beyond what most Americans can fathom. Most of us realize this debt is unsustainable, but we do not realize the reason our economy is suffering. It is because money is scarce, it is moving too slowly, and the government's source of revenue is itself, so it must print more dollars when the current source dries up.

In a letter to Samuel Kercheval, the author of our Declaration of Independence and 3rd President Thomas Jefferson wrote:

"I am not among those who fear the people. They, and not the rich, are our dependence for continued freedom. And to preserve their independence, we must not let our rulers load us with perpetual debt."

The government has loaded the people "with perpetual debt." Jefferson is right; it is the people who fear the government today, when it should be the government who fear the people. That will only happen when WE the People elect only those who will actually defend the US Constitution and the inalienable rights given to us by God, as identified by Jefferson.

We cannot allow our government to continue to load our posterity down with perpetual debt. Our continued freedom is depending upon our holding back this economic tyranny.

Although the late, great lion of the faith Adrian Rogers (1931-2005) was preaching about taxing people who work to entitle those who will not work (not cannot), our out of control national debt is a direct result of half of America's insatiable appetite to get something for nothing.

This something from nothing, this sense of being entitled, comes from a government willing to steal from one to give to the other, a distorted and evil notion of the fairy tale Robin Hood. And because this evil Robin Hood, aka government, has nurtured an entitlement mentality in half of the populace, we are rapidly reaching the end of this nation.

Democrats have long pushed government programs as a way of maintaining political power. ## TO THE STREETS

The something that needs to change is we can no longer allow Congress and any administration to continue on this perilous path to national bankruptcy.

By no means can we allow our national debt limit to be raised again. Do any of you believe that this will be the absolute last time we will have to raise the debt limit, no matter which party controls Congress or who resides at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue?

Here is what WE the People must do:

- 1. Call your congressman and two senators and ask them what is the purpose of having a debt limit if all they do is raise it every time they meet it? If they are going to raise it every time it is met, then get rid of it altogether! Let's see what they have to say to that!
- 2. If they are serious about getting rid of this debt and actually cutting unwanted spending, then tell them under no circumstances should they vote to raise the debt ceiling. Let them know that if they do, it will be a game-changer for you and you will do all you can to see they are not re-elected.
- 3. Sign the <u>pledge</u> at the Senate Conservatives Fund to stop the debt and balance the budget. Ask your elected representatives to sign the pledge.
- 4. Also sign the <u>pledge</u> at Cut, Cap, Balance.com and ask your elected representatives to sign the pledge.
- 5. Help your friends, relatives, associates, and neighbors to understand that even if we took the wealth of the 400 richest Americans, it would not even cover the budget deficit. The 400 richest people in America have a combined 1.57 trillion dollars, short of the estimated 1.6 trillion dollar deficit. So if we took the total worth of the 400 richest Americans, it would not even cover our budget deficit, much less the budget itself. Class warfare is not the answer.
